Vendor Conditions

1. All vendors must be at the hall by 9am on the morning of the sale.
2. All vendors need to bring their own foldable table to place the birds on.
3. All vendors will be required to pay a fee of \$50 before allocation of a space for display and sale of their birds.
4. Each vendor will be allocated a space in the hall, in consultation with the Show Manager.
5. The Show Manager has the final decision on allocation of all spaces for vendors.
6. No sales are permitted before 10am, and all sales will cease at 12 noon.
7. All birds must be caged in standard BCV show cages, each fitted with a drinker, and seed on the floor.
8. There must be no more than 4 birds per cage.
9. No sick or injured birds are to be offered for sale. The Show Manager reserves the right to require such birds to be removed from the sale.
10. Birds may be sold individually, in pairs or by lot, as agreed with each customer.
11. Prices may be displayed on the cages.
12. The final price for any bird or multiple purchase will be negotiated between the vendor and purchaser.

13. The vendor will be responsible for transferring the bird into the purchaser's cage (acknowledging that this is not ideal, but will be less likely to result in a bird escaping during the transfer).
14. All vendors will be responsible for their own sales, including having appropriate money for change.
15. Vendors will assist the Show Manager following completion of the sale at 12 noon, with cleaning up the hall.
16. All unsold birds remain the property of the vendor and must be removed from the hall during the clean up.

Purchasor Conditions

1. The sale is strictly held between 10am and 12 noon. Purchasers are not to enter the hall on the morning of the sale until advised by the Show Manager.
2. All vendors will have sale birds on display when you enter the hall.
3. You are permitted to look at the birds and discuss with the vendor, but are not allowed to touch the birds or pick up the cages.
4. You may negotiate a price for any bird, pair of bird or lot as you and the vendor agree. Some lots may be marked with prices by the vendor.
5. The vendor has the right to not accept your offer.
6. You must pay the vendor the agreed price before the bird becomes your property. Ideally you will have the correct currency to complete the transaction, but the settlement of the money is a matter between you and the vendor only.
7. You will need to provide your own cage for taking your purchased bird(s) from the hall.
8. The vendor will transfer your bird(s) into your cage, and you may then remove the cage from the hall.
