Rainbows is a combination of certain Mutations/colours. If you add another colour or take one away the bird is not considered to be Rainbow.

In order to breed Rainbow from scratch you need to get your hands-on Clearwing, Opaline and Yellow Face or Golden Face.

The pictures show 2 nice Clearwings and as you can see some are Clearer/Cleaner in the wing markings than others.

I've also attached a photo of a nice Opaline Clearwing, which is basically the body colour also in the wings and on the back.

You also have a picture of a Yellow Face (Opaline) and a Single Factor Golden Face (Opaline).

It does take years to breed Rainbows from scratch and its quite a journey but well worth the effort in the end. The last photo is of a pretty Rainbow.
